



#### **Unfinished Business**

- A plan has been prepared to transition leadership of the Chancel choir from Rev. Roger Bennett to Justin Moore. The Personnel Committee recommended approval of the plan. The goal is to ensure continuity, honor past leadership, and establish a clear vision for the future. Justin will become director of Music Ministry and Rev. Bennett will continue as Director of the Bell Choir. The timeline for this transition begins now and will continue through September The approved plan was referred to the Finance Committee to create a salary scale which will come back to the Board at the September meeting.
- The Board was presented a contract with City Wide Facility Solutions and BCC to deep clean the kitchen, the appliances and the floors. The appliances to be cleaned and degreased are as follows: Gas stove, gas ovens inside and out, dishwasher inside and out, tops and fronts of all cabinets, wipe down and clean the hood/vent exterior, microwave, degrease backsplash/walls near cooking area, sweep and degrease visible flooring, clean sinks, clean interior cabinets, clean ice maker, and clean the fellowship hall floor: sweep, vacuum, degrease and deep clean The cost of this cleaning has been increased to \$1,300 from its original quote. A motion was made by Doug Brinson to raise the approved amount for the project to \$1,300. The motion was seconded by Christy Beach and passed unanimously.


## Christian Womens Fellowship Shares Their Plans for the Fall
